



## What Can an RA Do About Relationship Abuse in the Dorm?

1. Display resources in your dorm
  - Bathroom flyers- separate information for both men's and women's restrooms
  - Door flyers- post Local Resources Contact Sheet and other information
  - Download information from [www.stoprelationshipabuse.org/resource-university.html](http://www.stoprelationshipabuse.org/resource-university.html)
2. Keep information in your room for emergencies, referrals, questions, etc.
  - Brochures from the Center for Relationship Abuse Awareness
  - College Safety Planning
  - Local Resources Contact Sheet
  - Stanford Incident Response Protocol
3. Inspire change! Arrange for a relationship abuse presentation in your dorm!
  - Presentation topics include:
    - ✓ How to be an Activist: Student Panel
    - ✓ How to Help a Friend
    - ✓ "That Doesn't Happen at Stanford": Power & Control in Relationships
    - ✓ "It's not like she hits her": Power & Control in Same-Sex Relationships
    - ✓ Movie Screening and Discussion of "Tough Guise" or "Beyond Beats & Rhymes"
  - Outcomes of dorm presentations:
    - ✓ Increased awareness of the nature and dynamics of dating abuse and what constitutes abuse.
    - ✓ Increased knowledge of available resources and tools to help friends, family and peers in unhealthy relationships.
    - ✓ Increased opportunities to become leaders in their communities.
