Stanford Community Partnership to End Violence Against Women

Stanford University extended its grant to end sexual violence and relationship abuse on campus. All students- **women and men, undergraduate and graduate**- are encouraged to become involved.

We highly encourage **men and graduate students** to apply.

APPLY TO BECOME A PAID INTERN!

Compensation for an INTERN:

Interns will receive a **\$1,000 stipend** upon completion of required projects.

Roles and Responsibilities of an INTERN:

Stanford Community Partnership to End Violence Interns develop violence prevention projects and provide peer leadership to their student communities about:

- What to do if sexually assaulted or abused
- How to prevent sexual violence and relationship abuse
- How to engage men and women as allies in ending violence

Interns are an essential part of the Stanford project and will work to build a healthy community, free from violence against women.

Interns will be selected from undergraduate and graduate populations, Greek houses, athletic programs, student government, and Community Centers, including the Women's Center, the LGBT Community Resource Center, the International Center, the four ethnic centers, and other areas of student life.

Each Intern will be educated to provide peer education services related to the prevention of violence against women.

To be an INTERN you must commit to the following:

- Must be available on campus from Fall 2009 through Fall 2010 (excluding the summer break)
- Attend mandatory weekly 1 hour meetings during the 2009-2010 academic year and during Fall Quarter 2010.
- Develop, implement and evaluate your approved educational plan during internship
- Undergraduate students: Complete the 3 unit Course on Violence Against Women in Fall Quarter 2009, (Tuesdays & Thursdays, 3:15-4:45 pm) and 1 unit weekly section (Time TBD) FEMST 138**
- Graduate students: Complete a two day training seminar (which will be scheduled at a later date).

**** To be considered for the internship, students must attend the first class session on Tuesday, September 22nd**

INTERN ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

From September 2009-December 2010*, for 6 hours per week, Interns will:

- Identify and work to change all aspects of the campus culture that perpetuate attitudes, beliefs and behaviors that result in the abuse of women
- Serve as role models for an effective community response by challenging attitudes, beliefs and behaviors that result in the abuse of women
- Attend/promote major campus events related to dating and sexual violence, e.g. Take Back the Night

**Not including Summer*

Fall Quarter 2009

- *Successfully complete the 3 unit INTERN Training Course in Fall Quarter 2008, (Tuesdays & Thursdays, 3:15-4:45 pm) and 1 unit weekly section (Time TBD):
 - Men will attend the section to work on the men against violence project.
 - Women will attend the section to develop awareness programming targeted to women
 - Graduate students will attend the section focusing on graduate specific issues
- Complete needs assessment of specific campus community through surveys and/or focus groups
- Develop educational plan to meet those needs
- Attend Intern Retreat

**graduate students will complete a two day training seminar*

Winter Quarter 2010

- Attend weekly Intern meetings
- Implement and evaluate pilot of educational plan
- Provide materials in multiple languages when needed
- Attend Intern Retreat

Spring Quarter 2010 and Fall Quarter 2010

- Implement and evaluate your approved educational plan
- Develop Sustainability Plan
- Offer a minimum of 1 dating/sexual violence prevention program per quarter
- Provide materials in multiple languages when needed
- Attend weekly Intern meetings
